Stock Transfer and Property

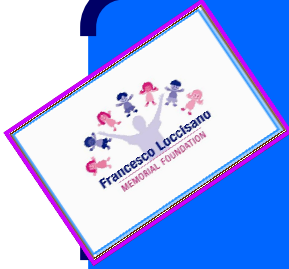
You may extend a gift of real estate, personal property or a stock transfer. You will also benefit capital gains savings as well as a full market value tax deduction.
